Legal requirements for travelers arriving to the Republic of Lithuania

1. Terms and definitions

Person exposed to COVID-19 – a person who was in contact with COVID-19 positive person, infectious disease carrier 3 days before and 10 days since symptom onset, or 72 hours before positive swab test result or 10 days after swab test where COVID-19 case is asymptomatic, or with a person who arrived from a country included in the list of COVID-19 affected countries approved by the Minister of Health of the Republic of Lithuania.

Affected countries – countries included in the list of COVID-19 affected countries by the relevant order of the Minister of Health of the Republic of Lithuania. The effective list of such countries is available at: https://nvsc.lrv.lt/en/information-on-covid-19/for-arrivals-from-abroad/list-of-countries-affected-by-covid-19-valid-from-22-february

Workers in critical occupations – workers exercising critical occupations defined in Communication from the Commission Guidelines concerning the exercise of the free movement of workers during COVID-19 outbreak 2020/C 102 I/03 (including posted workers and seasonal workers), also self-employed persons. The list of critical occupations is provided in **Annex 2**.

Critical infrastructure facility – Public Company ORLEN Lietuva listed as critical infrastructure facility by the decision of the Government of the Republic of Lithuania.

NPHC – National Public Health Center under the Ministry of Health of the Republic of Lithuania (*Lith.* NVSC).

HCI – a healthcare institution in the country of departure.

ESPBI IS – Electronic Health Services and Cooperation Infrastructure Information System.

Contact person in the Company – an employee of the Company's organizational unit responsible for providing information on the issues related to arrival of foreign nationals at the Company for business purposes. The list of contact persons is provided in **Annex 5**.

2. Documents required for foreign nationals on arrival and stay in the Republic of Lithuania (place of work, etc.):

- a) Passport of a foreign state or an equivalent travel document intended for traveling abroad, including the Republic of Lithuania;
- b) Where applicable, an employment contract, or a letter from a company, institution, or organization seconding its employee to the Republic of Lithuania constituting the confirmation of employment in the Republic of Lithuania; or a document certifying that a person is the owner and/or manager of a company, institution, or organization registered in the Republic of Lithuania, where such data are not available in the Register of Legal Entities;
- c) Documents proving that self-isolation exception applies (a document issued by HCI on negative test result, or a vaccination certificate);
- d) Other documents proving a person's legitimate activities in Lithuania.

3. Nationals of the European Economic Area (EEA) and other countries (List of countries provided in Annex 1)

3.1. <u>Mandatory registration on the NPHC website on arrival from all countries (both listed or non-listed as affected):</u>

- 3.1.1. Persons returning to or arriving from abroad by any mode of transport on international routes organized and operated by carriers as regular, special or charter services must fill in the form of **QUESTIONNAIRE** (https://keleiviams.nvsc.lt/en/form) and present the confirmation received (**QR code**) at the time of boarding.
- 3.1.2. In case of individual travelling by land, the arriving persons must fill in the form of **QUESTIONNAIRE** before crossing the border of the Republic of Lithuania, and present the confirmation received (**QR code**) to the NPHC specialists or the frontier crossing point authorities.

3.2. Mandatory requirement to hold negative test for COVID-19:

- 3.2.1. Persons arriving or returning to Lithuania must hold a document (issued in any official EU language) confirming the negative test for COVID-19 taken at maximum 72 hours before arrival/return to Lithuania (serological antibody test results are not acceptable) which, in case of international travels irrespective of the mode of transport, must be presented to the carrier.
- 3.2.2. Persons arriving or returning to Lithuania with private individual transport must have **negative test result for COVID-19** taken at maximum 72 hours before arrival/return to Lithuania **or** within 24 hrs after arrival **register for test** on hot line **1808** or contact and register for test with certified institution performing COVID-19 tests and get tested at time assigned (Institutions performing COVID-19 tests are listed in **Annex 4** hereto).

3.3. Requirements for self-Isolation:

- 3.3.1. Persons arriving to the Republic of Lithuania are subject to mandatory **10-day** isolation, with the following exceptions:
- 3.3.1.1. Self-isolation is mandatory however workers in critical occupations and those working in critical infrastructure facilities (the list of occupations is provided in Annex 2), arriving or returning from abroad, are allowed to leave the place of isolation for the performance of work functions at the specific place, by wearing nose and mouth protection (face mask, respirators or similar), well-fit and completely covering nose and mouth;
- 3.3.2. The period of self-isolation may be reduced by taking SARS-CoV-2 PCR test, at personal expense, on the 7th day of the self-isolation at the earliest, with a negative result confirmed, if no symptoms of acute upper respiratory tract infection (sudden development of any of such symptoms as fever, cough, shortness of breath) develop. In the event of negative result confirmed, self-isolation is not mandatory; however, the application for reducing the period of self-isolation shall be placed on: https://nvsc.lrv.lt/shorten-1.
- 3.3.3. To leave the place of self-isolation in the cases listed in **Annex 3** hereto, no permit from or notification to the NPHC is required.
- 3.3.4. Persons wishing to leave Lithuania before the end of the isolation period to the country where they live, work or where they will be provided with health care must **notify the NPHC 24 hours before departure by filling in the relevant form of Notification at https://nvsc.lrv.lt/notification-of-departure.**

3.4. Requirements for tests and self-isolation shall not apply, independently of whether a person has arrived from a country listed or not listed as affected:

- 3.4.1. To those holding document from HCI confirming that a person has recovered from COVID-19 with the COVID-19 confirmed through the positive SARS-Co-V2 PCR or antigen test, and maximum 90 days have passed from the positive testing until the return/entry to the Republic of Lithuania (such certificate is not required were COVID-19 was confirmed in Lithuania, and the data have been communicated to ESPBI IS [10], or for those holding the certificate from a healthcare institution, or an international certificate of vaccination proving that a person has been vaccinated according to the full vaccination schedule (when the purpose of arrival is not necessarily related to the performance of work functions). Documents referred to above must be issued in any official EU language and upon request presented to NPHC or officers checking persons for compliance with self-isolation requirements.
- 3.4.2. Those, travelling for the purpose of the performance of work functions, i.e. crew members who are employed in companies operating international commercial transportation, or who carry out international commercial transportation by all means of transport, in case of delivering or picking up cargo without staying in the Republic of Lithuania, or when transiting through the Republic of Lithuania.

3.5. Requirements for persons arriving from the countries subject to enhanced measures for communicable disease surveillance:

- 3.5.1. 3.3.1.1. for those arriving from the countries subject to enhanced measures for communicable disease surveillance listed in Annex 3, self-isolation is mandatory however workers in critical occupations and those working in critical infrastructure facilities (the list of occupations is provided in Annex 2), arriving or returning from abroad, are allowed to leave the place of isolation for the performance of work functions at the specific place, by wearing nose and mouth protection (face mask, respirators or similar), well-fit and completely covering nose and mouth;
- 3.5.2. To leave the place of self-isolation (except for leaving to the place of work in critical infrastructure facility) in the cases listed in **Annex 3** hereto, such persons **shall notify the NPHC** by filling in the relevant form at https://nvsc.lrv.lt/leave.
- 3.5.3. Persons wishing to leave Lithuania before the end of the isolation period to the country where they live, work or where they will be provided with health care must **notify the NPHC 24 hours before departure by filling in the relevant form of Notification at https://nvsc.lrv.lt/notification-of-departure.**
- 3.5.4. To change the place of isolation, a person **shall address the NPHC** in order to obtain the permission to go to another place of isolation if such person has to change it for some reason (permission is only issued to go to a place of isolation): https://nvsc.lrv.lt/permit.

4. Nationals of third foreign countries other than those listed in Paragraph 3

4.1. Entry permitted for:

Foreign nationals who hold a document confirming their right to reside in the Republic of Lithuania, or in whose respect the Migration Department under the Ministry of the Interior of the Republic of Lithuania has adopted a decision to issue a document confirming the right to reside in the Republic of Lithuania or has sent a notice to submit, within the set deadline, the original documents and biometric data required for the decision to issue a document confirming the right to reside in the Republic of Lithuania, and foreign nationals who are family members (spouses or persons with whom a registered partnership agreement has been concluded, children (adopted children), including minor children of spouses or persons with whom a registered partnership agreement has been concluded, parents (adoptive parents) and guardians) of the citizens of the Republic of Lithuania and of the foreign

nationals who hold a document confirming their right to permanent residence in the Republic of Lithuania.

Foreign nationals who hold a national visa of the Republic of Lithuania, or in whose respect the Migration Department under the Ministry of the Interior of the Republic of Lithuania has adopted a decision to issue a national visa.

In other exceptional cases when entry to Lithuanian is allowed for foreigners for the performance of work functions by a separate authorization of the Minister of the relevant governance area.

4.2. <u>Mandatory registration on the NPHC website https://keleiviams.nvsc.lt/en/form on arrival from all countries (both listed and not listed as affected):</u>

- 4.2.1. Persons returning to or arriving from abroad by any mode of transport on international routes organized and operated by carriers as regular, special or charter services must fill in the **QUESTIONNAIRE** at https://keleiviams.nvsc.lt/en/form and present the confirmation received (**QR code**) to the carrier before boarding.
- 4.2.2. In case of individual travelling by land, the arriving persons must fill in the form of **QUESTIONNAIRE** before crossing the border of the Republic of Lithuania, and present the confirmation received (**QR code**) to NPHC specialists or the frontier crossing point authorities.

4.3. Mandatory requirement to hold negative test for COVID-19:

- 4.3.1. Persons arriving or returning to Lithuania must hold a document (issued in any official EU language) confirming the negative test for COVID-19 taken at maximum 72 hours before arrival/return to Lithuania (serological antibody test results are not acceptable) which, in case of international travels irrespective of the mode of transport, must be presented to the carrier.
- 4.3.2. Persons arriving or returning to Lithuania with private transport must have negative test result for COVID-19 taken at maximum 72 hours before arrival/return to Lithuania **or** within 24 hrs after arrival register for test on hot line **1808** or contact and register for test with certified institution performing COVID-19 tests and get tested at time assigned. (Institutions performing COVID-19 tests are listed in **Annex 4** hereto).

4.4. Requirements for Self-Isolation:

- 4.4.1. Persons arriving to the Republic of Lithuania are subject to mandatory **10-day** isolation, with the following exceptions:
- 4.4.1.1. Self-isolation is mandatory however workers in critical occupations and those working in critical infrastructure facilities (the list of occupations is provided in Annex 2), arriving or returning from abroad are allowed, subject to a separate authorization of the Minister of a relevant governance area, to leave the place of isolation for the performance of work functions at the specific place, by wearing nose and mouth protection (face mask, respirators or similar), well-fit and completely covering nose and mouth;
- 4.4.2. The period of self-isolation may be reduced by taking SARS-CoV-2 PCR test, at personal expense, on the 7th day of the self-isolation at the earliest, with a negative result confirmed, if no symptoms of acute upper respiratory tract infection (sudden development of any of such symptoms as fever, cough, shortness of breath) develop. In the event of negative result confirmed, self-isolation is not mandatory; however, the application for reducing the period of self-isolation shall be placed on https://nvsc.lrv.lt/shorten-1.
- 4.4.3. To leave the place of self-isolation in the cases listed in **Annex 3** hereto, no permit from or notification to the NPHC is required.

4.4.4. Persons wishing to leave Lithuania before the end of the isolation period to the country where they live, work or where they will be provided with health care must **notify the NPHC 24 hours before departure by filling in the relevant form of Notification at https://nvsc.lrv.lt/notification-of-departure.**

4.5. Requirements for tests and self-isolation shall not apply, independently of whether a person has arrived from a country listed or not listed as affected:

- 4.5.1. To those holding document from HCI confirming that a person has recovered from COVID-19 with the COVID-19 confirmed through the positive SARS-Co-V2 PCR or antigen test, and maximum 90 days have passed from the positive testing until the return/entry to the Republic of Lithuania (such certificate is not required were COVID-19 was confirmed in Lithuania, and the data have been communicated to ESPBI IS [10], or for those holding the certificate from a healthcare institution, or an international certificate of vaccination proving that a person has been vaccinated according to the full vaccination schedule (when the purpose of arrival is not necessarily related to the performance of work functions). Documents referred to above must be issued in any official EU language and upon request presented to NPHC or officers checking persons for compliance with self-isolation requirements.
- 4.5.2. Those, travelling for the purpose of the performance of work functions, i.e. crew members who are employed in companies operating international commercial transportation, or who carry out international commercial transportation by all means of transport, in case of delivering or picking up cargo without staying in the Republic of Lithuania, or when transiting through the Republic of Lithuania.

4.6. Requirements for persons arriving from the countries subject to enhanced measures for communicable disease surveillance:

- 4.6.1. For those arriving with authorization (permission) of the Minister of a relevant governance area from the countries subject to enhanced measures for communicable disease surveillance listed in Annex 3 hereto, self-isolation is mandatory; however, workers in critical occupations and those working in critical infrastructure facilities (the list of occupations is provided in Annex 2), arriving or returning from abroad, shall be allowed to leave the place of isolation for the performance of work functions at the specific place, by wearing nose and mouth protection (face mask, respirators or similar), well-fit and completely covering nose and mouth, .
- 4.6.2. To leave the place of self-isolation (except for leaving to the place of work in critical infrastructure facility) in the cases listed in **Annex 3** hereto, such persons **shall notify the NPHC** by filling in the relevant form at https://nvsc.lrv.lt/leave.
- 4.6.3. Persons wishing to leave Lithuania before the end of the isolation period to the country where they live, work or where they will be provided with health care must **notify the NPHC 24 hours before departure by filling in the relevant form of Notification at https://nvsc.lrv.lt/notification-of-departure**.
- 4.6.4. To change the place of isolation, a person **shall address the NPHC** in order to obtain the permission to go to another place of isolation if such person has to change it for some reason (permission is only issued to go to a place of isolation): https://nvsc.lrv.lt/permit.

 - 1.1. Paramedical professionals;
- 1.2. Personal care workers in health services, including care workers for children, persons with disabilities and the elderly;
 - 1.3. Scientists in health-related industries;
 - 1.4. Workers in pharmaceutical and medical devices industry;
- 1.5. Workers involved in the supply of goods, in particular for the supply chain of medicines, medical supplies, medical devices and personal protective equipment, including in their installation and maintenance:
 - 1.6. Information and Communications Technology Professionals;
- 1.7. Information and Communications Technicians and other technicians for essential maintenance of the equipment;
- 1.8. Engineering professionals such as energy technicians, engineers and electrical engineering technicians;
 - 1.9. Persons working on critical or otherwise essential infrastructures;
 - 1.10. Science and engineering associate professionals (includes water plant technicians);
 - 1.11. Protective services workers;
 - 1.12. Firefighters/Police Officers/Prison Guards/Security Guards/ Civil Protection Personnel;
 - 1.13. Food manufacturing and processing and related trades and maintenance workers:
 - 1.14. Food and related products machine operators (includes food production operators);
 - 1.15. Fishermen;
 - 1.16. Staff of public institutions, including international organizations, in critical function.
 - 2. Individuals travelling for business purposes;
 - 3. Journalists acting in their professional capacity;
 - 4. Posted workers and seasonal workers.

¹ Exposed persons from the list may leave the place of self-isolation for the performance of work functions at the specific place, by wearing nose and mouth protection (face mask, respirator, etc.), well-fit and completely covering nose and mouth.

ENHANCED MEASURES FOR COMMUNICABLE DISEASE SURVEILLANCE APPLICABLE TO PERSONS ARRIVING FROM THE COUNTRIES LISTED AS AFFECTED

- 1. Exposed person who returned/arrived from abroad (countries listed as affected) (reference to the effective list provided in Annex 6 [4]), may leave the place of self-isolation in the following cases, subject to advance notification placed on the NPHC website by filling in the relevant form at https://nvsc.lrv.lt/leave:
- 1.1. To organize the funeral of a close person, the transportation of the remains and/or to attend a funeral ceremony/burial of a close person or to visit terminally ill patients;
- 1.2. To go to a healthcare institution to collect a swab specimen from the nasopharynx and pharynx for laboratory tests for COVID-19 disease (coronavirus infection);
- 1.3. To carry the persons who cannot take care of themselves to a medical institution to receive health care services or to collect a swab specimen from the nasopharynx and pharynx for laboratory tests for COVID-19 disease (coronavirus infection);
 - 1.4. To go to a specific institution to handle necessary legal matters there;
- 1.5. To go to governmental institutions, establishments and organizations at their invitation (except for private sector entities that may be visited only in case of the application of exceptions related to performance of work functions);
- 1.6. To leave the Republic of Lithuania before the end of the isolation period to the country where they live, work or where they will be provided with health care upon notifying the NPHC 24 hours before departure by filling in the relevant form of Notification;
- 1.7. To go to a healthcare institution to receive health care services (when leaving to a healthcare institution for urgent medical assistance, the NPHC notification is not mandatory);
- 1.8. In the event of advance registration at 1808 or by the NPHC, to go to a mobile station to collect a swab specimen from the nasopharynx and pharynx for laboratory tests for COVID-19 disease (coronavirus infection), or to carry the persons registered for COVID-19 test who cannot take care of themselves to a medical institution to collect a swab specimen at a mobile station (the NPHC notification is not required).
