

SUMMARY OF LEGAL REQUIREMENTS FOR FOREIGNERS FOR ENTRY TO LITHUANIA

Applies from 10 March 2021

1. Arrivals to Lithuania allowed.	1. Arrivals from EEA allowed. Arrivals from other countries require permit (visa) of Migration Department. 2. For international travels before arrival to Lithuania register with NPHC ³ completing a QUESTIONNAIRE at: https://keleiviams.nvsc.lt/en/form and, in case international passenger carriages irrespective of the mode of transport, present obtained QR code to the carrier. For travels with private transport register before arrival to the border of Lithuania and get QR code which will be requested at the border or passenger control posts by NPHC or other authorities.		
3. Hold a document (issued in any official EU language) confirming the negative test for COVID-19 taken at maximum 72 hours before arrival/return to Lithuania (serological antibody test results are not acceptable) which, in case of international travels irrespective of the mode of transport, must be presented to the carrier. If arriving with private transport, have negative test result for COVID-19 taken at maximum 72 hours before arrival/return to Lithuania or within 24 hrs after arrival register for test on hot line 1808 or contact and register for test with certified institution performing COVID-19 tests and get tested at time assigned.		
4. Mandatory 10 days self-isolation. The period of isolation may be reduced by taking SARS-CoV-2 PCR test on the 7th day of the self-isolation at the earliest, with a negative result confirmed, if no symptoms of acute upper respiratory tract infection (sudden development of any of such symptoms as fever, cough, shortness of breath) develop. If test result is negative, isolation is not longer required however Application to shorten the period of self-isolation must be placed at: https://nvsc.lrv.lt/shorten-1 ; Exclusion during isolation - it is allowed to commute between residence and work in critical infrastructure object².		4. Mandatory 10 days self-isolation. The period of isolation may be reduced by taking SARS-CoV-2 PCR test on the 7th day of the self-isolation at the earliest, with a negative result confirmed, if no symptoms of acute upper respiratory tract infection (sudden development of any of such symptoms as fever, cough, shortness of breath) develop. If test result is negative, isolation is no longer required however application to shorten the period of self-isolation must be placed at: https://nvsc.lrv.lt/shorten-1 . Exclusion during isolation - it is allowed to commute between residence and work in critical infrastructure object², to foreign citizens who arrive for work functions against the approval of the Minister of respective area.
5. Allowed to leave Lithuania before expiry of self-isolation period against at least 24-hour prior notification to: https://nvsc.lrv.lt/notification-of-departure		
6. Permit of NPHC to leave the place of isolation is not required in specific cases: to commute to healthcare institution, for legal matters, etc.	6. Test and insolation requirements and restrictions are not applied to persons who hold: - Document issued by HCI proving that they have recovered from COVID-19 and diagnosis has been confirmed with positive SARS-CoV-2 PCR test result or antigen test result made maximum 90 days before arrival to Lithuania (this document is not required if COVID-19 was diagnosed in Lithuania and data was communicated to ESPBI IS)); - Document issued by HCI or (national, international) certificate proving vaccination against COVID-19 according to full vaccination program with vaccine listed in the Register of Medical Products of the European Union (when the purpose of travel does not necessarily relate to performance of work functions). Documents referred to above must be issued in any official EU language and upon request presented to NPHC or officers checking persons for compliance with self-isolation requirements.		
Explanation: ¹ Analogous requirements are applied to Swiss Confederation, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Principality of Andorra, Principality of Monaco, the Republic of San Marino and the Holy See and third countries included by EU into the list of third countries exempt from arrival restrictions. ² Critical infrastructure facility – Public Company ORLEN Lietuva listed as critical infrastructure facility by the decision of the Government of the Republic of Lithuania. ³ NHCC – National Public Health Center under the Ministry of Health of the Republic of Lithuania (Lith.
